Re: COVID-19 Update

Vaccination Update:

On January 20th, Loch Lomond Villa vaccinated 206 individuals, 190 of which were our residents. It was a day filled with smiles, cheers, tears of happiness and making history. Our two Resident COVID Vaccine Teams did an excellent job planning, coordinating, administering the Moderna vaccine and providing after-care to each resident. During and after the administration of the vaccine, staff closely monitored each resident. We are pleased to share that none of the residents had a reaction to the vaccine. Many residents did have a sore arm the next day. Our team of six trained RN vaccinators administered the vaccines, on-site, over a 4-hour period. 95% of our nursing home residents received their first dose of the Moderna vaccine. Each resident will receive their second dose in 28 days.

On January 16th and 17th, 100 of our employees received their first dose of the Pfizer Vaccine. On January 20th, 16 employees received their first dose of the Moderna Vaccine; and on January 23rd, 5 more employees received their first dose of the Pfizer Vaccine. In total, 121 of our dedicated employees have been vaccinated.

Our Response to the Orange Alert Level:

We continue to deploy all our recreation team members along with other resources to each of our Resident Houses who are focusing on lessening isolation and increasing social connection and recreation programming. We do understand that these measures do not replace family members and therefore we hope to be able to welcome our Essential Care Partners back into our homes in the near future. As a Person-Centered Care Organization, these decisions are not taken lightly but we are trying to do the best that we can within the resources we have. Loch Lomond Villa has had 0 cases of COVID-19 to date and our number 1 priority is to keep our residents and our staff safe and healthy. We are aware that this pandemic has taken a toll on many of our residents and therefore we are closely monitoring several quality indicators. Some of the indicators that we monitor monthly are resident weights, falls, wounds, use of antipsychotic medications, infections, and fractures. Our Medical Advisory and Quality Management Committee meets this coming week. This team reviews all quality indicators and recommends action for any areas of concerns. In future updates, I will share with you our quality results.
